Changes are underlined

Proposed By-Laws pg. 89- Section 3. <u>Admission of members</u>.

b. <u>Proposal of members</u>. A Candidate for membership must be sponsored by an active member in good standing, and co-sponsored by two additional members, at least one of whom must be anticipated to be an active member during the provisional year of the candidate. A member may sponsor no more than two candidates per year, but may co-sponsor an unlimited number of candidates. Change two candidates to five.
