Members working at the market are expected to dress in like fashion.

Shirts: You must wear a Sugarplum t-shirt. These are black long sleeve thermal tees. Shirts will cost approximately \$15. (Like the red tights for Apple Annie this is a one time purchase unless your shirt becomes damaged or you choose to replace it.)

Bottoms:

You may wear khaki, denim, or black bottoms of your choosing.

Shoes:

Wear comfortable shoes as you will be on your feet most of your shift.

Nametags:

You must wear your Junior League name tag while you work.

Aprons:

Only those working as merchant aides, committee chairs, and co-chairs will wear aprons.

(These will be provided on site.)

If you have not yet received your tickets or your work shift, please contact Cara Dawson as soon as possible. There are several things that you need to remember when you arrive to work your shift.

- * Be 5-10 minutes early for your shift. This will give you time to find a place to park, check in at the office, and relieve your predecessor on time.
- As a courtesy to the customers, please park as far away from the coliseum as possible.
- * Leave personal items like purses in your car and out of sight. We do not have adequate safe space to store personal belongings. We will have a place for keys and cell phones in the office.
- * When you arrive, sign in at the office (the little room located to the left of the stage). You must sign in to get your hours. As a merchant aid, you are to wear an apron while you work and carry a bucket of supplies. All of this and your instructions for work will be given to you there.

DO NOT SHOP WHILE YOU WORK! Please plan to come early, stay late, or come another day to shop. When you are shopping, please do not wear an apron or a name tag. Wearing an apron or nametag signifies that you are

working and therefore should not be shopping.

Please do not chew gum during your shift. Peppermints will be available.

Do not consume alcoholic beverages or smoke in the coliseum.

Do not leave your post until someone relieves you. If the member who is to relieve you is late, inform a committee chair, and we will work to get your area covered so that you may leave.

When you leave, please sign out in the office. This lets us know that you have completed your hours. It also helps us insure that everyone has been properly relived and all areas are covered. If you do not sign out we may assume that you are AWOL.

Also, if you have not yet done so, please put your pink tree on the back of your car where your Apple Annie Apple was. A special thank you needs to be extended to our fill in Merchant Lounge Chair, Jennifer Harscheid. She has jumped in a done an excellent job getting things ready for our merchants and filling the empty position.




