### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**APPLE ANNIE-**No report due to the absence of Chairperson, Penny Joiner.

COOKBOOK - Chairperson, Allison Newton announced that the Cookbook Committee was considering several promotions of the cookbook as follows: 1) in April 2000, a possible mother/daughter luncheon or couple's dinner; and 2) for the 2000-1 League year and every other year thereafter, a cooking school using local cooking stars. It was announced that there were two more payments due on the cookbook and the League will need to look at the possibility of obtaining a loan to make those payments as well as payback the League the amount that has been loaned this vear. It was also announced that another cookbook promotional gift bag was being raffled off at the meeting for \$2 each or 6 changes for \$10. The winner was Goode Dethero. ## **Proposed Amendments to the By-Laws Muscle Shoals District Service League**

- 1. ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, Section 3. Admission of Members.
  - a. Number and County.

Change first sentence to read:

"There shall be a total of no more than one hundred seventy (170) active and provisional members in any one year, provided, however, that transferring members, returning non-resident members and reinstated members may be accepted at any time regardless of the existence of vacancies, provided that any such member will be able to fulfill the meeting and service requirements of membership for the year in which she is accepted."

(Proposed change is underlined; rest of section is unchanged)

ARTICLE IV, MEETINGS OF MEMBERS, Section 5. <u>Ouorum</u> Change first sentence to read:

"At any meeting of the members, whether annual, regular or special, one-third of the <u>active and provisional</u> membership shall constitute a quorum." (Proposed change is underlined; rest of section is unchanged)

 ARTICLE V, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 1, Number and Term Change to read:

"The Board of Directors shall consist of the elected and appointed officers of the League; the chairmen of the following committees: Finance, Future Policies, Apple Annie (Overall), Placement, Hospitality, Public Relations, HourGlass, Cookbook (Overall) and the Cookbook Treasurer. Both the Chairmen (or Co-Chairmen) and the Treasurer of any League fundraising event will serve on the Board of Directors during their tenure. The terms of members of the Board of Directors shall be the same as the terms of their respective offices."

(Proposed change is underlined)

4. ARTICLE VII, COMMITTEES, Section 2. Functions of the Standing Committee and Qualifications of Members. a. Admissions Committee Leave as is until the last two sentences, which shall read: "...In addition to the twelve voting members, the Executive Committee shall appoint five sustaining members to the committee, each of whom shall serve for a two year term. The number of appointments will alternate, three in one year and two the nest. The Admission Chairman shall notify the President-Elect in February of each year of the number of appointments to be made that year and the counties from which the appointees should come. One sustainer shall serve as the nonvoting chairman of the committee, and the four others shall serve as nonvoting advisors."

(Proposed changes are underlined)

ARTICLE IX RULES, Section 2. <u>Operating Rules</u>. Change to read:

"Rules of procedure and policy not covered by the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws shall be included in the Operating Rules. The Operating Rules may be amended by the affirmative vote of a majority of the members present and eligible to vote in a duly called meeting of the members. However, fund-raising issues will be voted on by secret ballot and any changes to League fund-raising projects must pass by a two-thirds vote of members present. Notice of any proposed amendment to the Operating Rules must be published in the HourGlass prior to the meeting at which such amendment is to be considered." (Proposed change is underlined)

### Proposed Amendments to the Operating Rules Muscle Shoals District Service League

BECAUSE ITEM #1 AND #2 ARE INTER-RELATED, THEY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED TOGETHER:

1. I. MEMBERSHIP, Section 3. <u>Provisional Membership.</u> B. <u>Provisional Program.</u>
4) <u>Fundraising.</u>

Delete the entire last sentence.

2. I. MEMBERSHIP, Section 3 Provisional Membership. B.

### Provisional Program. 7) Voting.

Add a new section to read:

"Provisional members are eligible to vote on any major policy changes, including changes in League fund-raising events, that will directly impact their League service requirements. Provisional members are also eligible to vote on disposition of all funds from any fund-raising event, including Apple Annie Day."

### 3. I. MEMBERSHIP, Section 3 <u>Provisional Membership</u>. B.

Provisional Program. 5) Leaves of Absence.

After the first sentence, add two sentences to read:

"Leaves of absence for illness are available to provisional members to the same extent and with the same restrictions as to active members; provided, however, that career leave and maternity leave are not available to provisional members. However, leaves of absence for personal hardship may be granted to a provisional during her provisional year. Such leaves may only be granted in extreme circumstances and only with the approval of the Board of Directors."

(Proposed additions are underlined. Remainder of section is unchanged)

4. I. MEMBERSHIP, Section 3. Provisional Membership. B.

Provisional Program. 6) Completion of Provisional

Requirements.

Change to read:

"If a provisional member finds she will be unable to fulfill her provisional year, a request for continuance of provisional status, whether due to a leave of absence under Section 1.3.B(5) above, or for other reasons, must be made to the Recording Secretary by April I of that year. Such request must list reasons for inability to complete provisional requirements and expected date of completion. She is not eligible to be voted into active membership at the annual meeting that year, but may, with the approval of the Board of Directors, complete her provisional requirements and become an active member during the following League year. A provisional member who fails to complete the requirements within this period shall be removed from membership. Regardless of the duration of provisional statues, at no time shall credit be given for provisional membership for more than one year toward total years of service."

(Proposed changes are underlined)

MEMBERSHIP, Section 4. <u>Obligations of Membership</u>. C. <u>Service to the League and the Community</u>.
 Changes to read:

"Unless otherwise provided in the Bylaws or in these Operating Rules, each active member except for the President and the President-Elect shall be assigned by the Placement Committee to serve on a standing committee; provided however, that Chairmen and Co-Chairmen of League fund-raising projects shall not be assigned any additional committee responsibilities. Each committee member shall participate in the meetings and activities of the committee."

(Proposed changes are underlined)

 I. MEMBERSHIP, Sections 4. <u>Obligations of Membership</u>. D. <u>Fundraising</u>. Change first sentence to read:

"Each active and provisional member shall participate in every fundraising project of the League, including, but not limited to, Apple Annie Day and cookbook sales."

(Proposal omits language about Follies)

7. II. FUNDRAISING, Section 1. Apple Annie Day, A. Officers.

Change first sentence to read:

"This project shall be overseen by the Apple Annie Committee, which committee shall have an Overall Chairman, two County Chairmen, two Town Chairmen, two Crate Chairmen, two Assistant Crate Chairmen, and two Bag Chairmen, all appointed by the President with the approval of the Executive Committee..."

(Proposed change is underlined; rest of the section remains as written)

II. <u>FUNDRAISING</u>, Section 1. <u>Apple Annie Day</u>. B. <u>Obligations of Members</u>.
 1)<u>Sales</u>.

Change to read:

"All active and provisional members shall sell not less than the minimum amount of apples set by the Apple Annie officers. Members may be given the names of several area businesses to solicit for sales of crates of apples, and such

sales and/or delivery shall be coordinated by the two Crate Chairmen and the two Assistant Crate Chairmen. Any conflicts relating to crate sales shall be resolved by the Overall Chairman.

(Proposed changes are underlined)

II. Fundraising, Section 1. <u>Apple Annie Day</u>. B. <u>Obligations of Members</u>.
 Polishing Party.

Change to read:

"All active and provisional members shall attend work at the Polishing Party held on the Sunday preceding Apple Annie Day. Members shall remain until dismissed by the Overall Chairman."

(Proposed changes are underlined)

II. <u>FUNDRAISING</u>, Section 2. <u>Cookbook Sales</u>. C. <u>Distribution of Proceeds of Cookbook Sales</u>.

Change to read:

"All expenses related to production, marketing, sale and distribution of the cookbooks shall be paid from the proceeds of such sales to the extent possible. Funds available for distribution from the sale of cookbooks will be donated to local charitable organizations in accordance with the vote of active and provisional members. The Finance Committee will research requests for the funds, and make recommendations for donations to the Board of Directors, which shall in turn make recommendations to the members."

(Proposed changes are underlined)

II. Fundraising, Section 3. Follies.
 Delete ALL of Section 3 dealing with Follies.

12. II. <u>Fundraising</u>, Section 4. <u>Other Fundraising Projects</u>. Change numbering to "Section 3";

Change to read:

"From time to time the League may sponsor other fundraising projects, subject to the approval of the members eligible to vote as provided in the Bylaws and Operating Rules. The Overall Chairmen or Co-Chairmen, a Treasurer (as deemed necessary), and other committee chairmen will be appointed in the spring preceding this project by the President with the approval of the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors. All active and provisional members are required to participate in such a project in the manner and to the extent determined by the Board of Directors. All expenses related to the completion of this project shall be paid from the proceeds of the project. Funds available for distribution from this project will be donated to local charitable organizations in accordance with the vote of the active and provisional members. The Finance Committee will research requests for the funds and make recommendations for donations to the Board of Directors which shall in turn make recommendations to the membership." (This section is a compilation of information so all miscellaneous fund raising projects will be set up as all fund raising projects currently are.)

III. PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS, Section 1. <u>Placement Committee</u>. C. <u>Placement Advisors</u>.

Add a new 2) and re-number from that point:

"2) <u>Assignment Day</u>. She shall attend the Assignment Day designated for the assignment of community service placements to members."

14. IV. FISCAL POLICIES, Section 3. Bonding.

Change to read:

"The President, the Treasurer, the Cookbook Treasurer and any other treasurer appointed by the Executive Committee, shall be bonded."

(The proposed change is underlined; omits Follies language and allows for all persons having access to League funds to be bonded.)

15. IV. FISCAL POLICIES, Section 4. League Funds.

Change to read:

"The League shall maintain the following separate accounts, all of which shall be supervised by the Treasurer, except the Cookbook fund, which shall be supervised by the Cookbook Treasurer. Other accounts may be established by action of the Board of Directors, and treasurers may be appointed as deemed necessary to supervise those accounts."

(Proposed changes are underlined. Also deletes Follies language)

16. IV. FISCAL POLICIES, Section 4. <u>League Funds</u>. Change to omit "E. <u>Follies Fund</u>." from the Operating Rules 17. IV. FISCAL POLICIES, Section 5. Annual League Budget.

Change to section to read:

"Each year at the regular March meeting of the Board of Directors, the Finance Committee shall present to the Board of Directors a proposed budget for the next fiscal year. This proposed budget shall be based on the budget projections submitted to the Finance Committee by the chairmen of the League committees. The budget as approved by the Board of Directors shall be submitted to the members for approval at the regular April meeting of the League. This proposed budget shall be published in the HourGlass prior to the meeting at which a vote will be taken. Expenditures may be made only in accordance with the approved budget, unless prior approval of the Board of Directors has been obtained." (Proposed changes are underlined)


