The Junior League of the Shoals held its February, 2009, meeting on February 2nd, at the Shoals Conference Center. The meeting was called to order by Meredith McClanahan, President.

Minutes: A motion was made to accept the January Minutes as published in the Hourglass. The motion was seconded and approved.

Membership Status: A Transfer Request was approved for Beth Ann Daniel and a Career Leave Request was approved for Amy Davis.

Treasurer's Report: Kerry Laughlin, Treasurer, reported that JLS will be able to distribute \$16,800 from Apple Annie and \$20,800 from Sugar Plum Marketplace. A change in the date for dues was also made. Junior League dues will now be due on June 1st. Dues will be considered late after the date of the September meeting. Dues may be paid in installments over the summer and may be mailed to the JLS Post Office Box. Any checks for dues for the upcoming year should be dated on or after June 1st.
