Apple Annie: Penny Joiner reported the following important dates: Pre-Sales deadline is October 17, Polishing Party is October 29, Provisional Sales are November 2, and AA Day is November 3. Each member is required to sell 15 bags of apples minimum, 20 would be even better. You should have been called by the Town chairs and selected your post location. The Crate chairmen are still selling all crates over the telephone to reduce duplicate calls. Each member will than be assigned businesses to deliver to at the PP. If you would like to deliver to a certain business, please let the Crate chairmen know tonight. October 17 is the deadline for pre-sales (bags & crates). Call your county's chair with your order. Pam Robert's corrected phone number is 764-2951. If anyone must miss either the PP or AA Day, you must let Penny know tonight. If you miss PP you will be responsible for having your pre-sold apples picked up at PP. All pregnant women must sign-up for a four hour shift in the AA office. Put apple decal on your car tonight and remove once you've finished you post on AA Day. Plant Sales this year will be Provisional Sales Day due to Wise's refusal to let us work the shift changes. 
