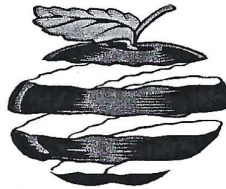

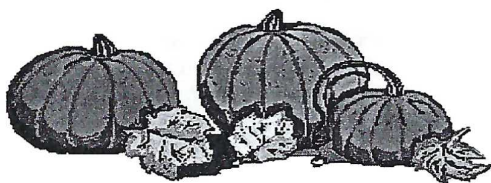

**MSDSL MEETING MINUTES –SEPTEMBER MEETING
SEPTEMBER 4, 2001**

The MSDSL held its board meeting at 7 p.m. on September 4, 2001 at the University of North Alabama. Lisa Keys-Mathews, President, called the meeting to order.

Roll: 88 members present and 34 absent; 43 provisionals present and 5 absent.

Minutes: Upon motion by Becky McDaniel and a second by Amy Darby the minutes from the May meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer: Penny Westmoreland reported the following balances:

She reminded members that our \$55.00 league dues are due November 15, 2001 and that her new address is listed in the new yearbook.

Correspondence: No Report

Other Business:

Lisa Keys-Mathews informed members that a nametag list was being passed for those who needed a new nametag (Cost = \$5.00).

Committee Reports

Apple Annie: Chairperson Mary Marshall Van Sant circulated handouts listing Apple Annie facts. She announced that no member should call a business unless the crate chairs were informed about the call and that each member and provisional would be responsible for selling 20 bags. There will be a check-out this year instead of a check-in. The committee will contact all members and provisionals about their posts. If contact is not made after 3 attempts, the member or provisional will be responsible for contacting the committee, or a placement will be assigned. The Apple Annie office will be at Woodward Avenue Baptist Church and all money will be due no later than Apple Annie Day. Lynn Bevis announced that Apple Annie t-shirts will be \$5.00 and asked that size and number of shirts desired be indicated on an order sheet at this meeting.

Cookbook Chair: Chairperson Lori Dolan reported that the cookbook debt is retired. She announced the following cookbook special: 5 or more books can be purchased for \$16.00 each. There will be a December craft and bake sale to raise money for the cookbook fund. If members bring the name, number, and address of a business (outside our area) willing to sale our cookbook, they will receive a chance in a drawing for a prize. If provisionals do the same, they will receive credit for the sale of a cookbook. If members need cookbooks, they should contact Lori Dolan or a member of the Cookbook Committee.

Cookbook Treasurer: No report.

Finance: Chairperson Becky McDaniel requested that members give her names and numbers of agencies interested in Apple Annie funds.

Future Policies: Chairperson Lisa Eckl requested that members inform her of any interest in policy changes.

Hospitality: Chairperson Amy Darby thanked her committee for their help with the provisional parties and informed them to expect a call about the May dinner.

Hourglass: In Tonya Southall's absence, Patty Klos reported that the next deadline is September 10, 2001 and that all members will receive the next newsletter via e-mail unless they notify Tonya otherwise.

Placement: Chairperson Julie Shook reported that summer placement hour reports are due and that September placement agencies should be contacted.

Public Relations: Chairperson Lynn Bevis reported that her committee would meet briefly after the general meeting.

Provisional Directors: Chairpersons Leslie Tomlinson and Tina Jhin reported that the next provisional meeting will be on September 15, 2001, at the new Westway Development Center. They informed the provisionals that the Children's Museum needed volunteers on Saturday mornings.

Rehabilitation: No report

Scholarship: Lisa Keys-Mathews reported that a scholarship committee consisting of Dana Lindsey, Joan Lane, Alison Isbell, and Leslie Howard will meet to set guidelines for our scholarship recipient.

Yearbook: Chairperson Kelly McCormack reported that yearbooks are available upon payment of dues.

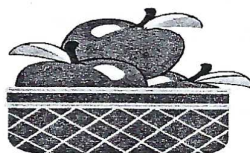
Transportation: Chairperson Janice Pride gave the following report: Requests totaled \$205.00 leaving a balance of \$2,295.00.

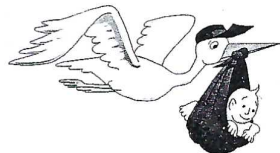
HourGlass Mailing
