Cheryl Ford Update



Cheryl is home with her parents now after spending nineteen weeks in ECM Hospital and two weeks at Healthsouth in Huntsville. Cheryl was injured in an automobile accident on March 5th. She sustained life-threatening injuries that included a broken neck, hip and ribs. She also lacerated a lung. She was in a coma for many weeks. During this time, she struggled to stay alive. While in the coma her broken body began healing itself.

She began regaining consciousness and finally was place in the step down unit in the Cardio Thorasic Unit at ECM. She began talking and recognizing family and friends but was having trouble with her short-term memory. She was transferred to Healthsouth in Huntsville where she completed two weeks of intensive rehabilitation. She is now living with her parents as she continues her rehabilitation at Healthsouth in Muscle Shoals three hours per day three days per week.

She is regaining her short-term memory and has even played a duet on the piano with her sister Donna Tips. Her prognosis is very good and her will is very strong. Her mother says she is walking with assistance and should be able to regain most all her mobility. She is truly a blessed individual.
